Philip Mansel, the author of 'King of the World: the life of Louis XIV' (2019), will discuss how the English were among the earliest and most enthusiastic admirers and imitators of Louis XIV's palace. English travel writers called Versailles the most magnificent palace and its Park the best in the world. Lord Chesterfield considered an hour at Versailles better spent than three hours in a study with the best books. After 1783, the Prince of Wales imitated Versailles in his redecoration of Carlton House. English visitors to Versailles, from the Duke of Devonshire to diplomats and officers, were frequent guests of Marie Antoinette's favourite the Duchesse de Polignac. Francophilia was as English as Francophobia.
